7. What disorderly conduct does Paul say he has heard about some of the Thessalonians?

8. What does Paul both command and encourage those who were guilty of such conduct to do?

9. What do you believe the exhortation 'be not weary in well doing' means?

10. Explain what Paul tells them to do concerning anyone who does not obey the words of his letter to them.

11. Why does he tell them to treat them this way (your answer to #10)?

10. What, according to verse 13, did the religious leaders realize (took knowledge of)?

11. Why couldn't they say anything to refute the healing of the lame man?

12. What conclusion do the religious leaders reach as to how to deal with Peter and John, and so that word of the miracle would not spread among the people?
